<b>SORGHUM, SHALLU (EGYPTIAN WHEAT)</b>	10-15#/A	April-July	"Egyptian Wheat". Shallu is the proper identification for the crop called Egyptian Wheat. It was first brought to the U.S. from India. It has become a most valuable crop for wildlife habitat. An excellent source of cover and food. Also called "Chicken Corn". It belongs to the sorghum family. Excellent as a feed and cover for birds. Plants are leafy and have some forage value. Well adapted to high humidity. Seed heads are large, creamy white, brittle but not hard, high in protein, & shatters freely when mature. It shades birds that scratch and feed off fallen seed. Plant 3/4" deep. Matures in 90-105 days. Heavy nitrogen user so fertilize well.
<b>SORGHUM, WGF (WILD GAME FOOD) -</b>	10-20#/A*	April-July	A most valuable source of winter food for quail and other wildlife. A short, fast maturing sorghum, which will produce seed, heads in 90 days or less. The plants will tiller and keep producing additional heads as long as there is moisture until frost. The seed is bitter until dry and the short stubby stalks (24-30" tall) stand up well protecting the quality of the seed. No bird will touch it until ripe, but when mature all birds will eat. This makes WGF a must for proving food when other food sources are depleted. Plant 10#/A drilled or 20#/A broadcast. Plant April-July.
<b>SOYBEANS, KESTER'S BOBWHITE TRAILING (RESEEDING TYPE) -</b>	20-30#/A	May-July	Bred and developed by Kester specifically for wildlife. Small greenish-brown seed about the size of grain sorghum. Produces long vines that wind and crawl up on corn, sorghum, & sunflowers. Deer also relishes the foliage. Matures in 85 days. Plant with something for it to climb on at 30#/A broadcast or 20#/A drilled with Corn, Sorghum, or sunflower. Plant MAY-July. Contains 40% protein.
<b>SOYBEANS, LAREDO -</b>	25-30#/A	April-July	This is a very heavy foliage plant, has a small black seed, all birds like as they mature and drop. Deer like these both for the forage and seed. These are different to the regular oil type bean. May be planted with another crop.
<b>SOYBEANS, QUAIL HAVEN -</b>	20-30#/A	May-July	(cultivate same as Bobwhite Soybeans)
<b>SUGARBEETS</b>	1-2#/A	Fall or Spring	Plant in Early Spring or Early Fall in South or April/May in North. The soil pH should be between 6 & 8. Plant in 18-24" rows.
<b>SUNFLOWERS, SMALL BLACK (PEREDOVIC TYPE) -</b>	10-30#/A*	April-August	Most popular seed we sell. Matures in approx. 100 days. Grows 4-5' tall. Sunflowers left standing provide cover for hunters while shattered seed attract birds. When mixed with Cowpeas, doves & quail will start feeding on the peas before the sunflowers mature. Plant 10-15#/A in rows, 25-30#/A broadcast, or mix 10# peas with 15# Sunflowers. Plant April-August. Plant some and have half the birds in the county eating lunch with you.
<b>VELVET BEANS -</b>	12-15#/A	March-June	Plant 1/4 - 1/2 Acre plots in woods or around edge of woods in corn or sorghum. Deer really love them. Plant 12-15#/A. March-June.
<b>VETCH, HAIRY -</b>	15-20#/A	Aug-Dec	An annual legume good for all wildlife. Plant August-December @ 15-20#/A. It does well when used in mixtures. Good to use on land to be planted in cotton. Has high residue that stands on top of soil longer than rye.
<b>Z-planting dates</b>		Note	A range in planting dates are given because of location and geography.
<b>Z-seeding rates</b>	*Note		A "broadcast" seeding rate is usually twice (2X) that of a "drilled" seeding rate

<b>Legume Inoculants -</b>			<p>Legume inoculants are cultures of nitrogen-fixing bacteria in a peat-based medium prepared for application to legume seeds before planting. Rhizobia working in nodules gather air nitrogen and make it available to their host. The strains of nodule bacteria are specifically selected for their ability to produce effective nodules on the leguminous plants for which they are labeled. There are three common ways of applying the inoculants to seed, the "Slurry Method" where you mix the inoculants with a liquid (1 ¼ pt per 50# of seed) and pour the mixture onto the seed and mix it in, the "Sprinkle Method" where you moisten the seed with a smaller amount of liquid (1 pt per 50# of seed) and mix the inoculants with the seed, and the "Dry Method" where you simply mix the dry inoculants with the seed in the planter hopper. All three methods are effective under ideal circumstances. Cool water may be used. A "soft drink" such as coke also makes a good "sticking agent". (Caution: be careful using chlorinated water) Plant inoculated seed within 24 hours of inoculation for best results.</p>
